March – Virginia 4-H "Spring Air" BB Championship. Maple Festival Service Day at Stonewall Ruritan Hall: clubs can count this as a club activity with majority attendance participating. Virginia Agriculture Week and Agricultural Literacy Week; Donut Box Assembly. Equismartz. Quarterly Highland 4-H Council Meeting

April – District 4-H Contest Day; Junior 4-H camp registration opens for campers; Teen Training begins for Camp Teen Counselors. Registration for VA State 4-H Congress opens. June – June 1st is deadline to nominate livestock for Highland Co. 4-H/FFA Show and Sale. Deadline for submission of Junior 4-H Camp paperwork. 4-H Camper Meet N Greet. Mary Cole 50-mile Ride. State 4-H Congress (age 14+) Quarterly Highland 4-H Council meeting.

July – Junior 4-H Camp; Livestock Project Tag Day (3rd Saturday). 4-H Dominican Republic trip (international opportunity). 4-H Intermediate Congress (age 12-13) at VSU.
